
## The American Legion Auxiliary Programs Fair


## 2016 ALA Girls Nation Service Project: Socks of Love

With veterans accounting for approximately 11 percent of America's total adult homeless, the American Legion Auxiliary treats veteran homelessness as a top priority among our mission to support and advocate for veterans, military, and their families. There are many ways our ALA Girls Nation senators can make a difference in the lives of a homeless veteran and this year's ALA Girls Nation service project socks of Love is one of them! Senators were asked to bring one pair of new tube socks and were provided with travel size items such as soap, shampoo, toothpaste, tissues, detergent, and deodorant to fill their sock with before attaching a note. Additional socks were available if senators forgot to pack a pair. The American Legion Auxiliary Girls Nation program is teaming up with the United States Veterans Initiative in Washington, P.C. to ensure that these socks are distributed to homeless veterans in the P.C. area.
